


In English, we have enjoyed exploring the texts Funnybones and Lost and Found. We used captions to write our own Funnybones booklets.







What is a meteorologist? Meteorologists collect and study data from the atmosphere and oceans to make weather forecasts and carry out research.

















In RE, we discovered who Jesus is and why Christians celebrate his birth. We studied the miracles of Jesus and the good news that he brought.






We found out about the Nativity story and retold different parts using drama and sequencing activities.




In RHE, we have been recognising and celebrating our strengths and abilities. We explored the strengths of different animals and then considered our own.






We discussed the term 'stereotype' and considered why stereotypes are not always kind or true. We celebrated equality and how we can all do anything that we put our minds to.








In Spanish, we have been learning about the seasons and colours.

We played lots of listening and speaking games with our Autumn leaves and made some beautiful artwork.


